QUALIFICATIONS NECESSARY FOR AN APPLICANT TO BEGIN A PIPE TRADES APPRENTICESHIP

- 1. Must complete and sign apprenticeship application in person at Local 777's training facility.
- 2. Must supply unofficial high school and/or GED transcripts and diploma by an assigned date.
- 3. Must attend a mandatory orientation at assigned date and time.
- 4. Must appear for an interview when notified with high school transcript or GED test results.

After the interview process, a decision regarding whether to extend an offer to join the apprenticeship program will be made. The applicant's acceptance of any offer of entrance into the program will be contingent upon submission of proof for the following requirements:

- 1. Must be at least 18 years of age.
- 2. Must present the following documentation:
 - ➤ Birth Certificate
 - High school diploma or high school equivalency (GED) certificate
 - Official school transcripts
 - Valid driver's license
 - Social Security Card
 - DD 214 Military discharge (if applicable)
- 3. Must pass a pre-employment drug screening and background check.
