**QUALIFICATIONS NECESSARY FOR AN APPLICANT TO BEGIN
A PIPE TRADES APPRENTICESHIP**

- 1. Must complete and sign apprenticeship application in person at Local 777's training facility.**
- 2. Must attend a mandatory Informational Session & Mathematical Assessment at assigned dates and times.**
- 3. Must supply official high school and/or GED transcripts by an assigned date to setup interview.**
- 4. Must appear for an interview when notified.**

After the interview process, a decision regarding whether or not to extend an offer to join the apprenticeship program will be made. If selected for an apprenticeship the applicant's acceptance of any offer of entrance into the program will be contingent upon submission of proof for the following requirements:

- 1. Must be at least 18 years of age.**
- 2. Must present the following documentation:**
 - *Birth Certificate*
 - *High school diploma or high school equivalency (GED) certificate*
 - *Official school transcripts*
 - *Valid driver's license*
 - *Social Security Card*
 - *DD 214 Military discharge (if applicable)*
- 3. Must pass a pre-employment drug screening and background check.**
